SATURDAY 28 DECEMBER

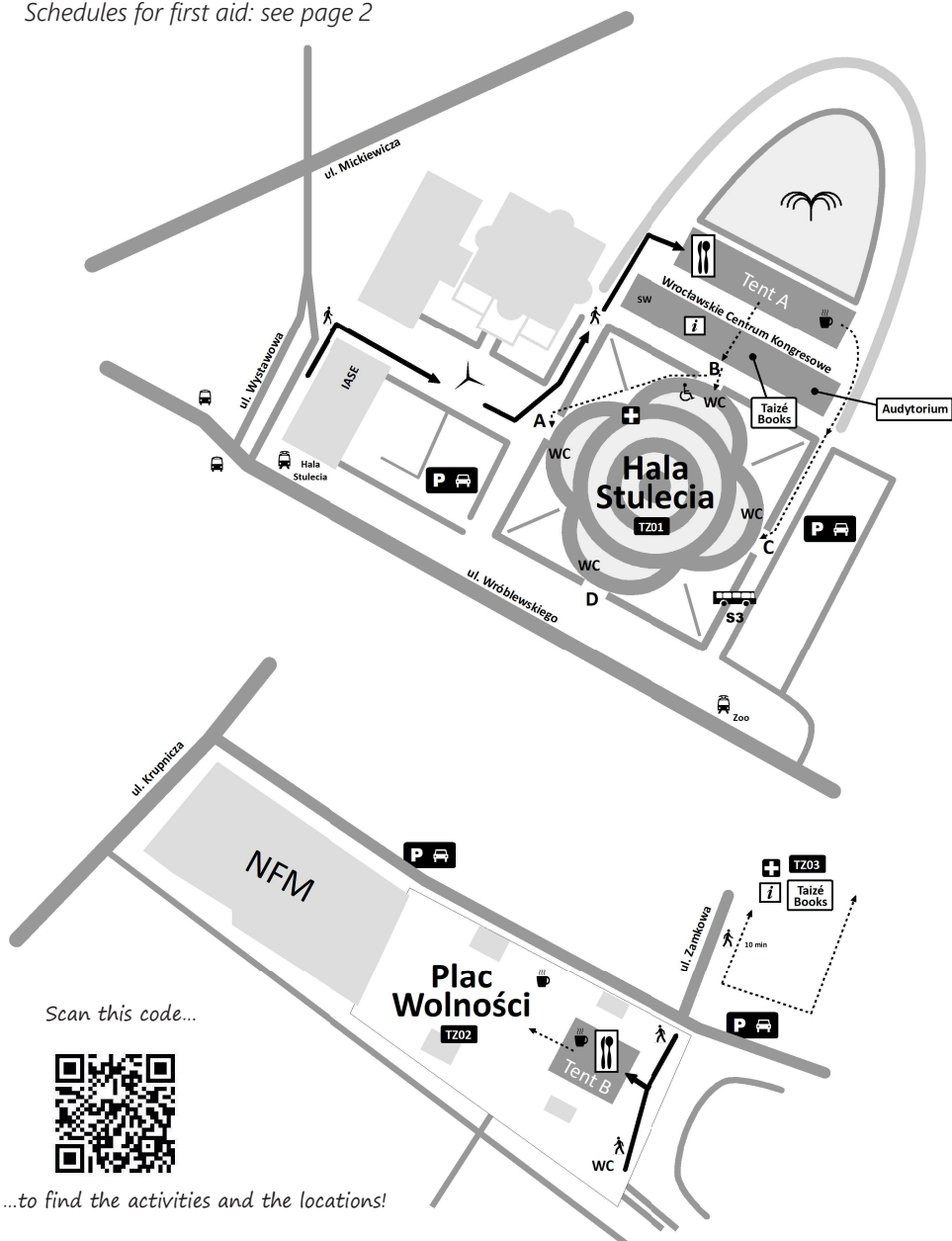
